First Session - Tuesday Morning

- (2) President Lloyd Sweatt, Pastor of Meadowood BC, Amory, called the 187th Annual Meeting of the Mississippi Baptist Convention to order by the sounding of the gavel.
- (3) President Sweatt recognized Gee Ogletree who will serve as the Convention Parliamentarian.
- (4) Sam Taylor, Senior Pastor, FBC, Petal, voiced the prayer.
- (5) Chip Stevens, Senior Pastor, FBC, Jackson, welcomed the convention messengers to FBC, Jackson.
- (6) President Lloyd Sweatt organized the 187th Convention. (8) President Lloyd Sweatt announced the Tellers and Credentials Committees as follows:

(10) Jimmy Stewart, Chairman of the Committee on Committees and Senior Pastor of FBC, Gulfport, introduced the committee members: Scott Hanberry, Pastor, Hardy Street BC, Hattiesburg; Hal Selby, Senior Pastor, Adaton BC, Starkville; Bill Hurt, Senior Pastor, Pleasant Hill BC, Columbus; and Lowell Walker, Jr, Pastor, Mt Sinai BC, Tupelo; and made a MOTION to adopt the

report as printed in the First Day Bulletin. **MOTION PASSED**.

(11) Jason Carson, Minister of Music, Meadowood BC, Amory, and Praise Team led in Congregational Worship – Psalm 150, Doxology, Praise Him, Praise Him, and Revive Us Again.

(12) Danny Smith, President of the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board and Pastor, FBC, Tunica, was recognized to give the Convention Board Report. He was joined by Debbie Battle, American Sign Language Interpreter and Member, Liberty BC, Flowood. (13) President Sweatt called for nominations for president of the Convention to serve in 2024. Russell Mord, AMS, Golden Triangle BA, Columbus, nominated Bill Hurt, Senior

Pastor, Pleasant Hill BC, Columbus, as President. Brian Hood, Lead Pastor, Community Point Baptist Church, Hernando, seconded the nomination. Nominations ceased. No other nominations were made. Michael Weeks, recording secretary, cast the single ballot "All for one and one for all."

(14) President Sweatt called on Doug Gunn, Chair of the Constitution & Bylaws Committee and member of FBC Jackson, to make a presentation.

Amendment Process for the Mississippi Baptist Convention's <u>Constitution</u> and The Plan of Organization and Action

Article VIII, Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Convention by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present subject to the following four stipulations:

- (1) Notice in writing setting forth the exact wording of the proposed amendment shall have been given at the annual meeting of the Convention of the immediately preceding year; (2) Such proposed amendment shall be published in the Annual and in **The Baptist Record**, and referred to the standing Committee on Constitution and Bylaws for study and recommendations;
- (3) Such amendment shall be adopted before the last day of the annual meeting;

(4) A quorum of the messengers shall be present at the time the vote is taken.

Article XXII, Amendments

This Plan of Organization and Action may be amended in the same way as the Constitution proper (see Constitution, Article VIII, Amendments).

Proposed Amendments:

THE CONSTITUTION Article VII. Powers

Section 1. The Convention shall have power and authority to own, aid, support, and control schools, colleges/universities, hospitals, residential child care agencies,...

THE PLAN OF ORGANIZATION AND ACTION

Article I, The Convention Board

Section 4. ... The Convention Board is authorized to receive gifts, accept donations, borrow money, execute notes, and make any and all other necessary financial arrangements in on behalf of the Convention; ...

Article VII, Trustees of Colleges/Universities, Hospitals, Child Care Agency

Section 1. Each college/university, hospital, or child care agency owned and supported by the Convention shall be operated and controlled by a board of trustees of at least fifteen but not more than thirty members elected by the Convention for terms of three years in the manner prescribed by the Bylaws of the Convention.

Article IX, The Education Commission

Section 2. The Education
Commission serves as a liaison between
the Mississippi Baptist Convention and
the Mississippi Baptist institutions of
higher learning. In particular, the The
Education Commission shall:

- (1) Cultivate the interest and financial assistance of Mississippi Baptists on behalf of Christian higher education;
- (2) Seek to strengthen the colleges/universities of Mississippi Baptists and unify the efforts of these institutions in the Convention program of to fulfill the

Great Commission through Christian higher education:

- (3) Receive, study, evaluate and offer necessary recommendations on annual reports, audits and recommendations of the educational institutions and the Board of Ministerial Education:
- (4) Inaugurate, promote and direct any program of study, survey, research or evaluation of the institutions as may be deemed necessary to the welfare and health of the institution or the Convention; (5) (3) Make recommendations observations, through the Convention Board to the Convention, concerning all cooperative efforts in the field of Christian higher education; for the promotion and/or enhancement of the Convention's educational institutions;
- (6) (4) Recommend to the Convention Board institutional apportionments or methods for determining these from the funds set aside by the Convention for Christian higher educations.
- (7) Be the channel through the Convention Board to the Convention for all matters relating to the total program of the Convention's educational institutions, including new or additional programs or projects, involving additional financial assistance from the Convention.

Article XVI, New Enterprises

Section 1. No new objects or enterprises involving the expenditure of money—shall—be—projected—by—any institution—or agency of the Convention until such object or enterprise is approved by the Convention. Announcement of the purpose—to—seek—such—approval—shall—be made—through—columns—of—The Baptist Record at least 30 days before the meeting of the Convention in which such request is to be made.

Section 2. Construction
on no new object involving the
expenditure of money shall be begun until
sufficient means is in hand for the
completion of such project, the sole
exception being that large projects
planned to be completed in units may be
begun when means are in hand for the
completion of first units; each subsequent
unit may then be begun when means are
in hand for the completion of it.

(Update remaining Roman Numerals in the Plan of Action and Organization, accordingly)

Article XIX XVIII, Reports

Section 2. The report of the Convention Board shall be divided into four three parts as follows:

- (1) Administration, including a resume of the principal activities of the year, **The Baptist Record** report, the treasurer's report, and the principal promotional ministry/program activities of the year.
- (2) The audit summary required in Article XVIII XVII, above.
- (3) Missions in Mississippi, including Sunday School, Discipleship & Family Ministry, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, Student Work, Evangelism, Missions Extension & Associational Administration, Church Minister Relations & Annuity, Church Music, Church Administration Pastoral Ministries, and any and all other activities promoted by the Convention Board in Mississippi.
- (4)-Missions outside Mississippi, including current activities of the North American and International Mission Boards of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Section 4. The report of the Education Commission shall include the reports of the schools and colleges and universities, the report of the Ministerial Board,...

WHEREAS, He served for four years as the Associate Editor of The Baptist Record, instituting several new features, including the Bible-based "Bibliocipher" and the "Life Answers" counseling column, and;

WHEREAS, He was baptized at age 12 at First Baptist Church, Belzoni, was a Royal Ambassador; he achieved the rank of Eagle Scout along with the God and Country Award and Order of the Arrow, and;

WHEREAS, Since age 12, he felt called into print journalism, graduating with a double major in Journalism and English from the University of Mississippi, then served as a general assignment reporter/photographer at the Daily Sentinel-Star in Grenada, receiving several awards from the Mississippi Press Association, and;

WHEREAS, He worked as press secretary and photographer for Mississippi Governor William F. Winter, and then as the public information officer for the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency before joining The Baptist Record, and;

WHEREAS, upon being named Editor, he led in a redesign of The Baptist Record, and in reestablishing The Record as the news journal for all Mississippi Baptists, and;

WHEREAS, He has served 27 ½ years as Editor making him one of the longest serving editors in The Baptist Record;

WHEREAS, During his tenure, he wrote over 1300 editorials, wrote or edited over a thousand news articles and feature stories. He wrote with clarity and consistency on matters of concern to Mississippi Baptists, such as denominational issues, the pro-life movement and, most importantly, evangelism, while always advocating for the work of the Mississippi Baptist Convention. He also consistently opened the pages of The Record to its readership by publishing thousands of Letters to the Editor and inviting many guest editorials, and;

WHEREAS, William Perkins has been a faithful family man, married 38 years to the former Marla Karen Davenport of Hattiesburg. Together, they raised two children, Brynne, a pediatric registered nurse and Will, a recent law school graduate.

NO. 3 RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF MISSISSIPPI LAWS REGARDING PASTOR SEXUAL ABUSE

WHEREAS, Sexual abuse is an abomination before God and an affront to the teachings of Scripture (Psalm 11:5; Proverbs 6:16-20; Mark 7:20-34; 1 Corinthians 5:1-2; Hebrews 13:4; 1 Peter 1:15-17); and

WHEREAS, Sexual abuse grieves Christ and contradicts the heart of the gospel (Mark 12:31; 1 Corinthians 6:18-19; 2 Corinthians 5:10; Ephesians 4:1; Philippians 1:27); and

WHEREAS, Sexual abuse violates the demands of Scripture for the holy living of God's people (1 Corinthians 6:18-19; Galatians 5:19-21; 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8; 1 Timothy 1:8-11); and

WHEREAS, Sexual abuse is an affront to the Imago Dei, dishonoring and degrading human dignity, especially in those most vulnerable among us (Genesis 1:26-27; Genesis 9:6; Psalm 8:3-5); and

WHEREAS, Pastors, ministers, staff, or counselors are in a position of trust, which is broken when the one in authority engages in a coercive sexual act with the victim, even with a misguided sense of consent, because the position of authority, trust and power held by the pastoral leader creates an unhealthy opportunity for abuse; and

WHEREAS, Those in pastoral ministry are entrusted with the responsibility, under the authority of Christ, to serve, shepherd, and guard those whom the Lord entrusts to their care (1 Timothy 3:1-7; Titus 1:7-9); and

WHEREAS, Sexual abuse perpetrated by pastoral leaders or church members is a violation of the sacred trust for pastoral leaders and all believers to care for and minister to people (Psalm 82:3-4; Proverbs 28:13; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; Titus 1:5-9); and

WHEREAS, Scripture makes clear that teachers will receive a stricter judgment, and therefore overseers must be above reproach, keeping watch over their souls as those who will give an account (James 3:1, Hebrews 13:17); and

WHEREAS, Sexual abuse causes grievous harm to those who are entrusted to the church's care and protection (Proverbs 31:8-9; Isaiah 1:17; Jeremiah 22:3-5; Micah 6:8; 1 John 3:16-18); and

WHEREAS, The Baptist Faith and Message, Article XV, condemns "all forms of sexual immorality" and states, "We should work to provide for the orphaned, the needy, [and] the abused"; and WHEREAS, Churches and individuals within our churches should be encouraged to report all cases of abuse to the appropriate authorities, and should be protected from civil liability in doing so. This obligation to report is particularly compelling when the abuser continues to have the opportunity for abuse with minors or other vulnerable individuals, and immunity should fully extend to such situations; and

RESOLVED, That the messengers to the Mississippi Baptist Convention meeting in Jackson, Mississippi, October 24-25, 2023 affirm the Bible's teaching to seek justice for those who have been harmed, protect the vulnerable, and honor the dignity and worth of survivors of sexual abuse (Genesis 1:26, Psalm 82:2-4, Isaiah 1:17, Micah 6:8); and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage the enactment and implementation of laws and actions that protect and support the innocent victims within our churches while removing the fear of civil liability from those who report instances of abuse in the church setting.

NO. 4 RESOLUTION REGARDING HAMAS' OCTOBER 7TH ATTACK ON ISRAEL

WHEREAS, God chose Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and the nation of Israel as His special treasure above all the nations on earth;

WHEREAS, God disciplined His people with captivity to Babylon in 586 BC

and ultimately with dispersion among all the nations of the world by the Romans in AD 70;

WHEREAS, At the end of the 19th century, God began to fulfill His ancient promises to gather His people from the ends of the earth, and in 1948 He restored their national identity;

WHEREAS, The nation of Israel has endured continual attacks from Hamas, Hezbollah, Palestinian Islamic Jihad and other terrorist groups in neighboring countries;
