As a part of Blue Mountain Christian University's 150th anniversary, the University held a two-day celebration line up of special guests, concerts, presentations, and alumni activities.

Jim Futral and Shawn Parker led the sesquicentennial Founders Day Chapel on Friday, Nov. 3. Futral, Mississippi Baptist Convention's Executive Director-Treasurer Emeritus and Parker, the current Executive Director-Treasurer, shared reflections of BMCU's past and expectations of BMCU's future.
