CONCEPTS: Life

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January 17 is Sanctity of Human Life Sunday. How ironic that three days later, a man and a woman will be inaugurated in Washington. D.C., who both support the wholesale murder of unborn babies. It is even more ironic that nine days after their inauguration, the March for Life will take place on the National Mall in Washington, D.C.

How sad that the majority of voters in the U.S. want elected officials who promote abortion.

We Bible believers must remain resolute in our opposition to abortion and infanticide. Abortion is the murder of an unborn child; infanticide is the murder of a live birth. Both are being practiced in our nation.

equally appalling. What COVID-19 has done to the elderly is tragic, but where is the outcry for what abortion has done to the babies of our land? Liberals want to lock down everything (including churches), while abortion clinics remain wide open. What hypocrisy!
